Children's rights

All children have the same rights. These rights are established in the Convention on the Rights of the Child of the United Nations. The United Nations is an organisation including virtually all the countries in the world. This means children's rights apply **to all children** worldwide.

On **20 November 1989**, the member states of the United Nations ratified a convention on the rights of children. To date, **196 countries** have agreed to enforce these children's rights. Only the USA is not a party to the convention. On 5 April, 1992, the **German government** adopted the Convention on the Rights of the Child. Since then, children's rights are also officially protected in Germany.

The UN Convention on the Rights of the Child consists of a total of 54 articles. 41 of these name individual rights for children. The other 13 articles explain what states have to do to enforce these rights. Children's rights can be divided into the categories **protection**, **fostering and involvement**.
